The modern rock war between Clear Channel's KYSR, Los Angeles (98.7) and CBS Radio's KROQ (106.7) has taken a new twist, with the former hot AC "Star" KYSR now in the face of heritage KROQ - and winning some demos in the January Arbitron PPM. One thread suggests that both KROQ and its sister "Jack FM" KCBS-FM (93.3) have made some modifications to respond to KYSR. That discussion's happening here. [»](#)

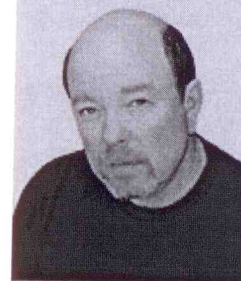
In Flagstaff, Arizona, adult alternative "Eagle 103.7" KZGL is sold for \$350,000. It was previously owned by Walker Radio and has recently been in the hands of The Kalil Holding Group as a receiver. Buyer of the Class C3 facility is Tower Investment Trust, whose principal is Bill Brothers. Broker - Tucson-based Kalil & Co.

Long Island AM WNYG (1440) is sold to the not-for-profit Radio Cantico Nuevo, headed up by the Rev. Erick Salgado. That group is already LMAing the station for \$2,000 a month (plus expenses) and is also leasing 42 hours a week on another New York-area AM owned by Arthur Liu's Multicultural Radio. (That's WNSW, Newark at 1430). Long Island's WNYG is being sold for \$150,000, and it's a measure of the economy that Arthur Liu agrees to take only about \$25,000 of that in cash. The rest (\$124,992) is payable over time in a promissory note. WNYG was historically licensed to Babylon, in Nassau County. Now it's re-licensed to Medford with 1-kw days/189 watts after dark. The Nassau-Suffolk Board of Radio-Info.com is talking about Arthur Liu's sale, now. [»](#)



In Nebraska, there's a \$1.1 million closing of a deal that began as an LMA in 2006. The station is rock "Thunder" 103.1 KKJK, with Lex & Terry in morning drive. It's a Class C1 (100-kw at 640 feet) licensed to Ravenna, and it serves Kearney, Hastings and Grand Isle. Jay Vavricek-led Legacy Communications began LMAing it in 2006 and just now exercised its option to buy. Seller is Community Radio, led by Don Wilks and Jeff Shapiro. Broker - Mike Bergner.
